#### Fresh Food Now More Available

As a cornerstone of health, fresh food nourishes us with vitamins, minerals, flavor, and joy. Studies show fresh foods have higher nutritional benefits than processed foods, which means better health – and let's face it: when we feel better, we make better decisions, have more energy, and lead happier lives.

Because fresh foods have a shorter shelf life than processed foods, storage becomes the challenge. Earlier this summer, Exodus Family Ministries received two new refrigeration units to increase our capacity to store and distribute more fresh produce, meats, dairy items, and eggs. Special thanks to **Anthem Medicaid** for donating a new refrigerator and stocking it with fresh produce AND to **Dare to Care**, the **Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels**, **Samtec**, **John Waters Heating**, **Cooling & Electric**, and the donors from last year's Give for Good Louisville campaign who made the purchase and installation of a large walk-in refrigeration and freezer unit possible. We can now distribute more fresh food items to the families and individuals we serve in our area.
