Grand Opening for Exodus Community Resource Center!

We are excited to announce the grand opening of the Exodus Community Resource Center, the first of its kind in Southwest Louisville! Save the date, October 10th at 10 am because you are invited to our grand opening **event**. The event will take place at The Grand, 4205 Cane Run Rd, Louisville, KY 40216, with tours available of our facility next door.

It is our vision to help the unhoused transition from the streets to stability. Our resource center will meet basic needs by providing showers, laundry services, hot meals, clothing, hygiene, and other items. As people are brought in to have basic needs met, partner organizations will come onsite to provide services to eliminate barriers. These services will include access to healthcare, mental/physical health appointments, common assessments to move towards housing, IDs, birth certificates, access to employment, registration for inpatient/outpatient recovery services, and much more.

In the evenings, there will be classes on applying for jobs, attaining a GED, budgeting, eating healthy, and more. As a faith-based group, we will also offer - but won't require – Bible studies, prayer, and spiritual support to those in our community who are struggling.



Give for Good Louisville

Give for Good Louisville - the region's largest single day of giving - will be on Thursday, September 14. Last year, your support helped us raise nearly \$8,000 to help fund the purchase of a large walk-in refrigeration unit for our food pantry. This year, our goal is to raise \$15,000 to help our unhoused neighbors find their way from the streets to stability through our soon-to-beopened Exodus Community Resource Center.

Senior Commodity Boxes

Earlier this month, we got the opportunity to launch the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) through Dare to Care and the USDA. The CSFP works to improve the health of low-income seniors (60 and older) by supplementing their diets with nutritious USDA Foods. EFM is always looking for new ways to meet apparent needs in the community, as the number of seniors visiting the pantry has been on the rise over the past several months. This program will allow qualifying seniors access to an additional box of food each month. We currently have 52 clients signed up for the program. Our distribution day will be the second Saturday of the month from 1 pm – 3 pm. Delivery is available on a limited basis. A huge shoutout to volunteer Mary Lou Ballard, and her team as they worked so hard to implement this program. Each client was served with dignity and a smile during the first distribution.
