

## Backgrounder

Exodus Family Ministries focuses on the Southwest Louisville communities to work alongside individuals and families and guide them to a better life through food provision, clothing assistance, and connection to needed services.

Our name comes from the book of Exodus, which tells how God guided Moses to lead the Israelites out of Egypt, and into a better life. We feel we've been called to a similar mission of working alongside our neighbors in challenging environments and helping them into a better life. That's why Exodus has created support services to spark hope and nurture the steps to move from the desperation of the streets to stability.

We began serving the Shively area in 2014 as a local community ministry. In 2020, we changed our name to Exodus Family Ministries. In the beginning of the pandemic, Exodus pivoted to education and food when we saw families needing assistance as they struggled with educating their children at home and putting food on the table. A clothing closet was added as well.

Throughout 2021, Exodus served more people than we imagined through our food pantry, which was supported by Dare to Care, Kentucky Harvest, and Meijer Grocers. In 2023 we average 175 food boxes a month – each box serving 3 to 4 meals for four people.

As the community faced changing school and job landscapes due to COVID, Exodus launched a summer tutoring program in partnership with Highland Park Community Development Corporation. This transitioned into offering an after-school Non-Traditional Instruction (NTI) program to benefit both parents and children - at no charge to the families. In 2022, as children returned to school, and the number of unhomed people rose in our community, our focus shifted, and we closed the tutoring program and pivoted to outreach in the fast-growing homeless communities in our area.

As we saw an increase in young adults and seniors who were one medical bill or rent increase from the edge of living in the streets, Exodus began to provide more services to the unhoused and housing insecure. We started taking food, clothing, and hygiene items to them and worked with them to secure forms of identification, and other needs.

To address the root causes of the growing homeless crisis in our area, we have opened the Exodus Community Resource Center to provide basic needs like showers, laundry facilities, and meals. We are partnering with other groups to offer needs assessments, referrals to social services, and adult classes for nutrition, finance basics, and GED assistance. The outpouring of neighbors and organizations joining hands with us to help others amazes us every day as we continue our work to walk with and guide people in our community to a better life.

## **Programs**

It is our goal to encourage and support our neighbors in the Southwest Louisville area. A healthy, stable, and vibrant community begins with stability in health, housing, and employment. We do the work we do because of our faith, but do not require clients or volunteers to belong to a certain church or practice a specific religion.



### **Food Pantry**

The food pantry provides food access to those struggling to make ends meet or who may have health or mobility issues preventing them access to food. Our food pantry operates two weekends each month. Families can pick up meal boxes on a first-come, first-served basis, with limited deliveries made if arranged in advance. A family must bring a valid driver's license for identification when picking up. Food partners include community groups, Dare to Care, Kentucky Harvest, and Meijer Grocers.

## **Clothing Closet**

Our clothing closet accepts donations of gently used clothing, shoes, blankets, and new hygiene items from individuals and organizations. We then sort and organize these items to offer them at no cost to other neighbors in need. Properly fitting and stylish clothing helps both children and adults feel more comfortable in their surroundings and gives them dignity and self-confidence. Clothes can be picked up two Saturdays a month or delivered with an appointment.



### **Resource Center**

Our Resource Center offers basic services like showers and laundry facilities for the unhoused. We partner with organizations to offer common assessments, identification documentation, education, job skills, interviews, and access to treatment programs for addictions and other needs. Providing these services in the vicinity of our unhomed neighbors eliminates the barrier of travel required to apply at each organization and lets them connect and receive services in a non-threatening environment. We offer life skills education like GED classes, financial literacy, job interviewing and resume help, and nutrition guidance, among other topics.

## **Impact**

Exodus Family Ministries helps people on their journeys to self-sufficiency by providing food, clothing, and education as well as connection to jobs, housing, social services, and addiction recovery. When people are encouraged, provided resources, and are not alone, their path forward opens with hope and change. They can see more possibilities and have courage to move into what's possible.
