Recap of our Resource Center One-Year Celebration!

On October 10, Exodus Family Ministries held a one-year celebration of the Exodus Community Resource Center, which is the city's only full-service day shelter for the unhoused outside of I-264. When the center opened last fall, the goal was to serve 100-150 unsheltered individuals living in the south end. We've tallied our results and, to put it mildly, we FAR EXCEEDED our expectations thanks to our staff, volunteers, community partners, and donors. Senior Commodity Boxes

Last fall, the Exodus food pantry began offering **Senior Commodity Boxes**, a special government program that provides low income seniors (ages 60 and up) with a large box of food to supplement their nutritional needs each month. These shelf-stable, pre-packaged boxes are offered in partnership with <u>Dare to Care</u> and the USDA. Exodus currently has 90 seniors enrolled in the program, which provides the boxes on the second Saturday of the month from 1:30-3pm via the pantry at 6501 Bethany Lane. There is currently a waiting list for the program. **Seniors must be pre-approved to participate**. Volunteer of the Month

"Mama" Vicki Logsdon may be small, but she has a big passion for the people Exodus serves at the resource center and it shows. While she is extremely humble and will tell folks that what she does "isn't any more important than what everyone else brings to the program," she (and her team's cooking) may be THE reason many clients come back to the center week after week! In addition to coordinating a team of helpers in the kitchen who provide substantive meals to keep clients from going hungry, she brings with her a wealth of experience and information since she has a background in social work, a strong commitment to the area, and a deep faith.

She believes that "if you listen, God will put you where you need to be to learn what you need to learn." She feels blessed to have been involved "on the ground floor of Exodus' work with the unhoused" nearly four years ago and feels that if she has been able to help even one person by the end of each day that she has made that day count for something.

She admits that working with the downtrodden "requires a special calling," yet feels the work is very rewarding, especially since she has had family members impacted by addiction. She became truly committed to feeding those on the streets after paramedics told her that her grandson survived what should have been a fatal overdose of Fentanyl "only because someone had given him a good meal before he had taken it." So, as long as Mama Vicki is around, you can bet everyone is going to have a hearty meal.
